

# INDEX OF CHANGES

## October 2015

- New contract soy infant formula added, Gerber Good Start Soy.
- Enfamil ProSobee no longer contract brand, changed to an unapproved formula for Idaho WIC.
- Nestle HealthCare Nutrition, Inc. introduces Alfamino Infant (Idaho WIC approved).
- Nestle HealthCare Nutrition, Inc. introduces Alfamino Junior (Idaho WIC approved).
- Added Similac Go & Grow Sensitive Stage 3 – Milk Based Formula (*Not Idaho WIC approved*).
- PediaSure clear will be discontinued (Start to phase out March 2015).
- PediaSure/Sidekicks will have a minor label/color change. There are no nutritional changes to the product.
- Added Nutricia North America PhenylAde GMP (Idaho WIC approved).
- Nestle HealthCare Nutrition, Inc. introduces Gerber Extensive HA (Idaho WIC approved).
- Neocate E028 Splash and Neocate Splash Unflavored products separated.
- Enfamil infant, Gentlease and Nutramigen (Only Nutramigen is Idaho WIC approved) will change their 32 fl. oz can RTF product to a plastic bottle. There are no changes to the formulation.
- Nutramigen with Enflora LGG Toddler was reformulated; fructose will be removed starting November 2015.
- Portagen will change in can size to 14.4 oz (64 fl oz reconstitution) November 2015.
- Enfagrow Toddler Transitions 32 oz RTF will be discontinued November 30, 2015.
- EnfaCare will have a reformulation that includes a change to the whey:casein ratio, increased vitamin D, and aligns the nutrient profiles of the powder and liquid formulations.
- Nutricia North America announces several new metabolic products.

**NOTE: For infants, Anamix Early Years will replace the Analog products by 2016. Periflex Early Years will replace Periflex Infant by 2016.**

## February 2015

- Isosource 1.5 Cal product updated (*Not ID WIC Approved*).
- New label color for ProSobee from blue to green.
- New label color for Enfagrow Toddler Transitions Soy from blue to green (*Not ID WIC Approved*).
- Enfagrow Toddler Transitions powders can size change from 21 oz to 20 oz (*Not ID WIC Approved*).
- Gerber Good Start Nourish is discontinued.
- Polycal introduced.
- New flavors of the PKU Periflex Jr Plus added, new flavors include Orange, Berry and Vanilla.
- Wal-Mart exclusive Enfamil formula RTF 4-pack is discontinued. Will change to a 6 pack (*ProSobee is the only ID WIC approved formula impacted*).
- Sections separated in the Formula Handbook Folder on the WIC Website instead of one large document.
- New table format created for federal regulations including supplemental exempt formula for partially breastfed infants table derived from federal table 1.
- Policy Reminders updated.
- Calculation and Examples updated.

## October 2014

- The term WIC-eligible “nutritionals” will replace the term “medical foods” for WIC. The definition of the term remains unchanged, formula companies may still use the term medical food.
- Federal Regulation tables for Maximum Monthly Allowance and Full Nutrition Benefit updated.

- Added guidance to forms MDF and DB.
- Updated policy reminders section to reflect new Food Rule regulations.
- CoramRX has transitioned to CVS Caremark Specialty Pharmacy.
- Nutricia introduces TYR Anamix Next, a nutritional for children over 1 year of age. Nutrition for Tyrosinemia.
- MetaGenes introduces KetoVolve a product previously by Solace Nutrition for ages 1-8 years old with intractable epilepsy.
- Enfamil Enfaport will transition from 8 oz. to 6 oz. bottles.
- Change postponed for Neocate E028 Splash reformulation and discontinuation of tropical flavor.
- Neocate Splash unflavored option with formulation changes available July 2014.
- XPHE Maxamum Drink is now called Periflex LQ. No change to formulation, only name and flavors.
- Periflex Junior was updated to PKU Periflex Junior Plus with reformulation.
- Puramino is reformulated to add 33% more MCT oil.

## February 2014

- Mead Johnson introduces Enfamil Reguline infant formula.
- Carnation Instant Breakfast Essential RTD reformulated and new flavor.
- CoramRx is an Apria healthcare Company now handling medical foods and formula.
- Neocate Jr. with Prebiotics has a new strawberry flavor.
- Neocate E028 Splash will now be Neocate Splash. Flavors and formulation changes have occurred to this product.
- Similac Sensitive, Spit-up, Total Comfort will change to 19 kcal/ fl oz. and no longer meet USDA definition for standard formula.
- Can size change for Similac Sensitive, Spit-up, Total Comfort to 12 oz cans.
- Similac Advance will have 3 stages. Similac Advance stage 1(birth-12 months) is the current product eligible for WIC/standard milk based formula. Stage 2 (6-12 months) is a new formula and Stage 3 (12-24 months) is currently the Go and Grow milk based product.
- New Optigro symbol replaces early shield on Similac products.
- Enfamil Lipil will be renamed Enfamil 24.
- ProSobee reconstituted amount changed from 92 to 93 fl oz.
- Premium removed from Enfamil Newborn and Enfamil Infant.
- Enfamil graphics change to all products.
- Enfamil for supplementing introduced (not WIC approved).
- Similac for supplementation introduced (not WIC approved).
- Ketocal 4:1 powder was reformulated.
- Polydose is discontinued.
- Acerflex is discontinued.

## August 2013

- Nutramigen AA is now PurAmino.
- Nutramigen LIPIL is Nutramigen.
- Similac Care Advance 20/24 w/ iron is now Similac Special Care 20/24 w/ iron.
- Neocate is now only Neocate infant w/ DHA and ARA.
- KetoCal 4:1 LQ has an unflavored option.
- Neocate Junior and Neocate Nutra can labels will reflect the minor change of 14 oz can to 14.1 oz can.
- Enfamil Premature 20 and Nutramigen Toddler w/ Enflora LGG have been added to the exempt list.
- No longer Optimental, now only Vital products.
- CIB juice drink is unavailable.
- The Enfamil and Similac HMF have been removed from the Exempt list, these are not Idaho WIC approved, but are WIC approved. May be considered on a case by case basis.
- Similac Total Comfort has been added to the product guide, but continues to be a non-contract formula not Idaho WIC Approved.
