Rates 2009 and 2011 are based on the National Center for Health Statistics, estimates of the July 1, 2009 and 2011 United States resident population from the Vintage 2009 and 2011 postcensal series, prepared under a collaborative arrangement with the U.S. Census Bureau, Internet release dates July 23, 2010 and July 18, 2012. Population data for 2010 is provided the United States Census Bureau, internet release date March 10, 2011.

Data may differ from previously published reports due to updates in the data bases.
