INFORMED CONSENT/CHOICE FORM

WHAT IS SERVICE COORDINATION:

Service Coordination is an activity that will assist eligible individuals to gain and coordinate access to necessary care and services appropriate to the needs of the individual. Service coordination is not available to an individual, whose needs can be met by other service coordination or case management resources, including paid or non-paid sources.

WHAT DOES A SERVICE COORDINATOR DO:

A service coordinator will assist the individual to access, and coordinate or maintain services that are needed. They will complete an assessment, develop a plan, and help link the participant and/or family to the necessary service providers. Service coordinators will monitor and follow-up as needed to ensure the plan is implemented and adequately addressed. They will make adjustments to the plan when needed to ensure plan consistency and non-duplication between services.

YOUR CHOICES:

Service coordination is an optional service and by signing this form you are demonstrating that you have been informed of the service coordination options available under the Children's DD Program and Idaho Behavioral Health. You or your parent/guardian are aware that you may refuse service coordination services and may change service coordinators or agencies at any time if you are not satisfied with service coordination. If you choose to change service coordinators you are aware that you can contact Health and Welfare at 364-1940 to request a list of available agencies or request that the new agency process the change application for you.
